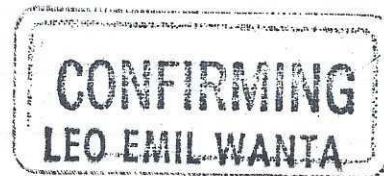

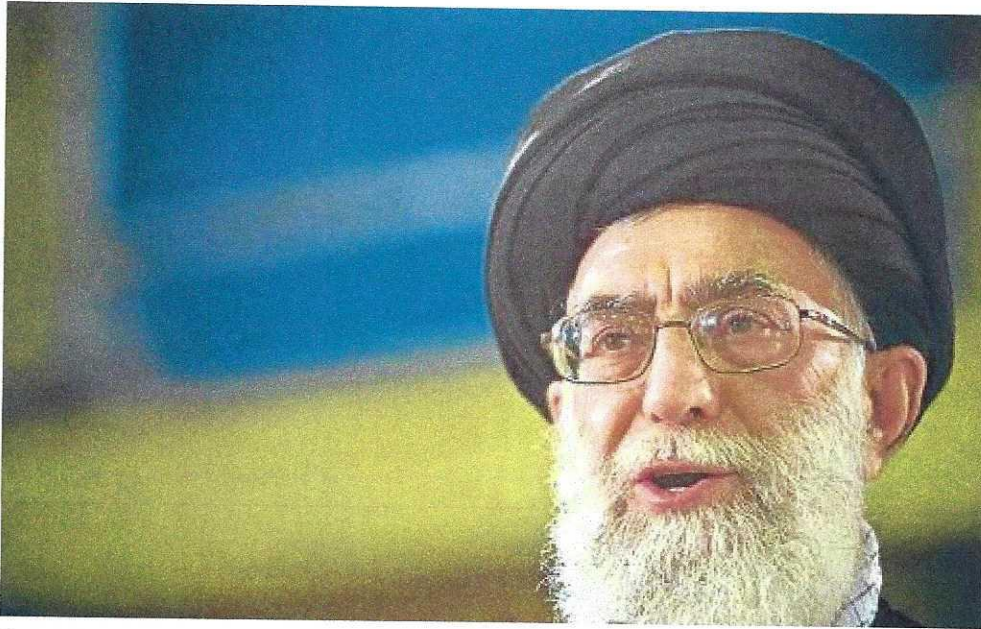

## Why Iran's Supreme Leader could be the protests' ultimate victim

Ayatollah Ali Khamenei is no longer above criticism from voters and theologians.

Forget the threat posed to Mahmoud Ahmadinejad by the political unrest that has swept Iran this week. It is Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, the regime's Supreme Leader, who should really be sweating about his future.

For the past two decades, the 69-year-old has been the ultimate source of power in Iran. A middle-ranking cleric who was elevated by his mentor, Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini, during the final months of his life, Mr Khamenei exercises enormous influence over the way the country is run. But when he delivers today's sermon at Friday prayers in Tehran, which is normally broadcast nationwide, he will be fighting as much to save his own position as that of his beleaguered president.

To date, the anger of the protesters, who yesterday observed a "day of mourning" in memory of those killed, has mostly been directed against Mr Ahmadinejad, who is widely believed to have rigged the election result. But the longer the protests continue, the more Mr Khamenei's own role is being called into question. It was Mr Khamenei who backed Mr Ahmadinejad's meteoric rise from being a junior city councillor in Tehran to his election as president in 2005.

Before then, the man responsible for safeguarding the founding principles of the Islamic republic had constantly been at loggerheads with his elected representatives. He clashed frequently with Ali Akbar Hashemi Rafsanjani, who served two terms as president following Mr Khomeini's death, particularly over Rafsanjani's attempts to adopt a more constructive approach towards Iran's relations with the West.

Tensions between Supreme Leader and head of state deteriorated further when the moderate Mohammed Khatami won a surprise victory in the 1997 elections. Even though Mr Khatami served two terms as president, it was during his rule that the regime's hardliners began to organise nationwide vote-rigging, particularly during elections for the Majlis, or parliament, to ensure that moderates were isolated from power.

When Mr Ahmadinejad won the 2005 election, there were allegations of electoral fraud – including the use of dead Iranians' birth certificates to swell voter numbers. The widely held suspicion that Mr Khamenei has been complicit in another rigged election means the country's Supreme Leader now finds himself under pressure from Iran's disaffected voters.

During past political crises, Mr Khamenei and his conservative cohorts have been able to call on the Revolutionary Guards and Basij militia, the self-appointed guardians of the Islamic revolution, to suppress political opponents, whom they denounced as un-Islamic. But it is Mr Khamenei's misfortune that in the present crisis he has lined up against him a formidable battery of opponents, whose Islamic credentials, and support for the revolution, are beyond reproach: Mr Rafsanjani, Mr Khatami and Mir-Hossein Mousavi, the defeated presidential candidate who is leading the protests, have all held senior positions over the past 20 years.

In addition, Mr Khamenei is also facing criticism from a powerful clique of Iran's leading theologians, based in the city of Qom. In Iran, the grand ayatollahs are still held to be the nation's spiritual guardians – unlike Mr Khamenei, whose stature as a theologian is frowned upon by more learned clerical colleagues. It was in the seminaries of Qom that the first seeds of the Islamic Revolution were sown, when Mr Khomeini was one of the city's leading clerics. But now the Association of Combatant Clerics, a 50-strong group of leading ayatollahs, has issued a strongly worded statement denouncing last week's election result as invalid.

To add to his woes, Mr Khamenei is facing a cleverly orchestrated campaign by Mr Rafsanjani to readjust the regime's power balance in his own favour. Like many once-prominent politicians, Mr Rafsanjani feels he has been sidelined during Mr Ahmadinejad's presidency.

Even so, he still remains head of two of the regime's most powerful bodies: the Expediency Council, which adjudicates in disputes over legislation, and the Assembly of Experts, which appoints, and theoretically can replace, the Supreme Leader.

For the moment, Mr Rafsanjani's ire is mainly directed at Mr Ahmadinejad, who made a thinly veiled attack on his probity as a businessman – he recently featured in the "Millionaire Mullahs" section of *Forbes* magazine's Rich List – during the election campaign. Mr Rafsanjani senses that the protests have left his rival vulnerable and hopes that he can exploit the crisis to consolidate his power base within the regime's inner sanctum.

In the past, for example, the 75-year-old Mr Rafsanjani has been mentioned as a possible successor to Mr Khamenei as the country's Supreme Leader. At the very least, Mr Rafsanjani and the other leaders of the protests will expect Mr Khamenei to offer some conciliatory gesture during his sermon today. If not, Iran's Supreme Leader could soon experience his own day of mourning.
